family and friends, chronic illness, and hearing loss. According to the Center for Disease Control nearly one-fourth of adults aged 65 or over are considered socially isolated putting them at risk for dementia and other serious medical issues.

In its August 3, 2022 journal report, the American Heart Association (AHA) warned that social isolation and loneliness puts people at a 30% higher risk of heart attack, stroke, or death from these events.

Our Village is so much more than a ride to a doctor or physical therapy. We are a community of folks who want to connect with others. Members and volunteers can look at the Events insert or view our online Events Calendar and reach out to register for an activity. Try attending a lunch or a Meet and Greet. Join one or all of our fun and amazing holiday events including this month's Friendsgiving (see box), so we can all celebrate together. And, if it feels overwhelming, call and request a friendly visit from one of our volunteers. Make the first step that will brighten your life and change it for the better.

Tech Tip: Free Phones to Help You Stay Connected

FREE Specialized Phones Help You Communicate Better

If it is getting a bit harder for you or someone you know to use your home or mobile phone, you should know the State of California offers **free** phones to make it easier for you to stay connected. Over half a million Californians use these specialized phones from the California Public Utilities Commission's Deaf & Disabled Telecommunications Program which is funded by a small surcharge on California phone bills.

These specialized phones use advances in technology to support difficulties with hearing, speech,

mobility, vision or memory. Their unique features including amplification, photo or bigger buttons, flashing lights or talking keypads, headsets and neck





loops, visual displays of spoken words, speakerphone, programmable memorydialing and various accessories - give you the extra support you may need to stay engaged in the conversation. Most phones are hearing-aid compatible and

there are no additional costs beyond your regular telephone service.

California residents with telephone service and a doctor who will approve the need are eligible to apply using this simple, 3-step process: 1) print and fill out the application form from their website, 2) have your doctor sign the application, 3) you mail or fax the form. Once approved, you call California Phones to discuss which phone is best for you.


The Events Team has a great time planning all the events on the CVV calendar every month. We love hearing the positive feedback we get. As we do our planning, it's important for us to get accurate counts of the number of people who are coming...and we really need your help for this.

Here's why: If we are going to a venue, they ask us to give them a count anywhere up to a week in advance. Restaurants want to know how many tables and servers to reserve for us. Additionally, the places catering our Friendsgiving and Holiday parties have to know how many meals are required. In some situations we're given a limit to the number of people who can attend. In others we may need to make sure we have enough drivers to accommodate everyone.

Here's how you can help: Register as soon as possible. If you have to cancel...even at the last minute... please let us know right away. Otherwise we may be waiting for you to arrive before we go somewhere, start a game or begin a ZOOM meeting. We understand that things happen or you may not feel well, and we'll cer-

tainly miss you. If there are limits, someone might want to go in your place.

To cancel your attendance, you can click on the **Cancel Registration** button that's on the same page where you registered online, call a Call Manager (leave a message if calling after hours) or contact the Host listed on the registration page.



If plans change and **you can join in at the last minute**, please try to contact the Host or a Call Manager at (805) 372-1826 so the host and venue can be made aware of it beforehand if there is room.

There's lots of fun scheduled for the holiday season. We hope you can join us!
