



Tulips, Castles & The Matterhorn: Danny & Mary visit Europe

Adventurous travelers
Danny and Mary White began their
trip at the end of April in Amsterdam. There they visited the world
famous Keukenhof tulip gardens
where more than seven million
bulbs were in bloom. Beautiful! In



the world's largest flower park they viewed spectacular mixes of color showing off the best of Dutch tulips, crocuses, narcissus (daffodils), and other bulb flowers in a park setting that has many art pieces, special displays, restaurants, and a real Dutch windmill.

From there they boarded a boat to cruise along 460 miles of the Rhine River, including the 40-mile gorge



where robber-barons built castles from the tolls they had forcibly collected from the boats passing through their area. These castles are in various stages of repair, some mere shells standing on the hillside as proud relics of a time past while others are in various



stages of repair and are open for visitors.

The last leg of their journey in May took them to Switzerland where they rode trains each day and traveled in a clockwise circle through the Alps rising to elevations of 8,000 to 10,000 feet. During their

Switzerland train tour they had very interesting stays in Zurich, St. Moritz, Geneva, and Lucerne. They really enjoyed the train network in Switzerland where the trains always run on time, the train stations are easy to navigate, and the passenger cars are both clean and comfortable.

In Zermatt they were truly blessed to have breath-taking views of the Matterhorn which rises 15,000

feet above the valley floor. There they took a cable car up the mountain to view the valley and surrounding mountain peaks.




